This year, Dr. Keith Wilner (B.A. 1978) and Dr. Nancy Winchester (B.S. 1990; Ph.D. 1994) are the recipients. Dr. Wilner is currently the Global Clinical Lead, DMD and Lung Cancer at Pfizer. Dr. Winchester is currently the Director of Research Development, Rubber and Adhesives at SI Group.

In April it was announced that Prof. Kristin Bowman-James was elected as an American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS) Fellow, recognizing her for contributions to supramolecular anion coordination chemistry. Prof. Bowman-James also received the Joseph G. Danek Award from the EPSCoR/IDeA Coalition and Foundation recognizing her long-term commitment to enhancing the research infrastructure in Kansas through the Established Program to Stimulate Competitive Research (EPSCoR).

»»» Prof. Shuai Sun named Textbook Hero

Prof. Shuai Sun was named the 2024 Textbook Hero by KU Libraries for creating an open textbook, "Breaking Barriers: Diversity and Equity in Chemistry." Prof. Sun created the textbook in collaboration with students and transformed the work to an Open Educational Resource (OER) — a book that is free to use and available to anyone — with the support of KU Libraries. The textbook introduces important minority chemists and their research to students in introductory and General Chemistry courses, showing how chemistry interacts with modern society and affects human life every day.

Prof. Heather Desaire has been awarded the rank of University Distinguished Professor, effective August 2024. Nominations of current KU faculty members for distinguished professorships come from academic departments and schools on the Lawrence campus. Major criteria for selection include a record of exceptional scholarship, participation in university affairs and professional organizations, service to community and support for the growth and success of their students, colleagues and the institution. Prof. Desaire is the fourth professor currently in the department with this rank.
